

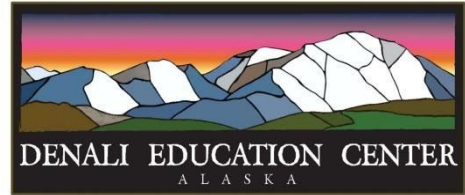
Position Description

DEC Overview:

Denali Education Center (DEC) is a non-advocacy, for-purpose organization and partner of Denali National Park and Preserve. Our mission is to promote understanding and appreciation of Denali through fun, informative, and inspiring programs. Our 10-acre campus is home to 12 guest cabins, a combined classroom and dining hall, a yurt, and a community event space. We operate week-long learning vacations in cooperation with numerous educational groups and organizations, primarily Road Scholar. In addition, we offer a suite of youth programs, evening events, lectures, and community programs. Denali Education Center is a diverse organization, with its roots firmly planted in the local community and Denali National Park and Preserve.

Position Overview:

Group Leaders are responsible for leading Road Scholar learning vacations, both on our campus and throughout Alaska. They work closely with other DEC Program Staff to provide fun, educational, and memorable experiences for participants. The Group Leader provides consistency throughout the program itinerary and, as such, has the opportunity to greatly influence the program's impact. They add context to our itinerary to allow for smooth transitions between scheduled pieces of each program and help ensure that each group experiences all program elements in a seamless, meaningful way.

Main Position Responsibilities:

- Work with learning vacation staff prior to each departure to acquire and review all necessary program documents
- Travel with groups to each location and orient them with confidence; accompany guests at meals and participate in all scheduled daily activities
- Coordinate with support staff (kitchen, administrative, event, etc.) at each location to ensure a cohesive and memorable experience for guests
- Be proactive and plan ahead for each segment of the itinerary, notifying vendors of emergent group needs, reconfirming reservations when necessary, and anticipating potential complications to ensure each program runs smoothly.
- Anticipate and resolve program issues as they arise. Group leaders may have to navigate a variety of personality types, mobility issues, dietary restrictions, cancellations, inclement weather, etc., and generally work to facilitate group synergy throughout their travels.
- Other shifts and duties may be assigned to help ensure that all staff are familiar with campus resources and DEC's suite of youth and adult programs.
- Support DEC's sustainability efforts by actively recycling, sorting recyclables into the proper bins for collection, and using environmentally friendly products when possible. They should help educate guests about DEC's efforts to recycle and encourage them to participate

Qualifications:

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Reliable and attentive leader, able to effectively communicate with diverse groups of up to 35 people with confidence and compassion
- Problem-solving skills are imperative: candidates must have the ability to “think on their feet” and act quickly and calmly
- Display working knowledge of the flora, fauna, culture, and infrastructure of Alaska, especially in the geographical areas in which our programs operate
- Desire to engage with and get to know our ever-curious and always-changing groups of lifelong learners
- Flexible self-starter able to work independently and creatively
- Highly organized and detail-oriented
- Previous residency or employment in the state of Alaska
- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs. while assisting with guest baggage
- Clean, insurable driving record
- Access to a reliable cell phone
- Ability to have *fun* and maintain a *positive attitude* while working long hours to facilitate each program’s itinerary.

Preferred Knowledge and Skills:

- 2+ years of large group management experience
- Computer literacy; including proficiency with Microsoft Office
- Current CPR and First Aid Certification, or willingness to train
- 21+ years of age preferred

Compensation:

- Starting pay for Group Leaders is \$250/program day.
- All travel, accommodations, and meals are included for Group Leaders during scheduled program days as well as one day pre-and post-program, if needed.
- Employees will receive pooled and divided program gratuities on their final paycheck as a seasonal bonus.

Disclaimer:

Due to the extensive travel required for this position, on-campus housing is not available. Applicants with in-state housing preferred.
